#### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

#### SAFETY, OPPORTUNITY, AND HOPE FOR OUR NEIGHBORS

Let me make a confession. Growing up in middle class America as the son of hard working parents who made great sacrifices to

provide for basic needs of their children and to offer them every opportunity, I came to believe that poverty was simply the result of a lack of values or ambition. "A man who doesn't work, doesn't eat," I remember a neighbor saying one night at a backyard bar-bque. Everyone around the table nodded in affirmation as we filled our plates with seconds.

Thankfully, these sad and regrettable biases are in my past. Though there might be a ring of truth in them regarding some folks I have known, I have come to understand that the vast majority of people living below the poverty line in America are hard working men and women who wish for their children everything I wish for mine. I have truly repented for allowing my self-righteous attitudes to guide my response to the people around me. It's time to take action.

# "IT'S TIME TO TAKE ACTION."

In an article addressing poverty in America in the July edition of The Rotarian, Northwestern University scholar, Alex Kotlowitz, asserts that poverty is more than a lack of money—It has more to do with a lack of safety, opportunity, and hope. The causes of this condition are varied, but the solutions may be related to something profoundly simple—love and empathy. When we address the systemic causes of a problem without a sense of empathy for the people we are serving, we dehumanize the project. Only when we see those who are struggling around us not only as humans, but as neighbors do we find the basis for our service.

As we seek ways to take action in the coming year, it is my hope that we will see the people we serve for what they really are—neighbors seeking a life free from fear while looking for opportunities to improve their future.
