Dr. Sumi Kawaratani was completed just this past June. The High Standard Electro Mechanical Filtration systems constructed in Myanmar, funded in part by the members of our Club, remove arsenic and provide life giving potable water for drinking & cooking and allow for water storage year round. Project founder, **JT Warring**, shared several moving stories that reminded us these systems are the difference between life and death to many villagers in Myanmar.

On Sunday, over 100 Rotarians gathered at the spectacular home of **Tony Medley** to enjoy Spanish wines and tapas and each other's company. Tony and his staff welcomed us as we toured the historic home in Hancock Park.
