A message from the President

The statistics are sobering—over 2000 children in LA County are waiting to be adopted. Seventy-five percent of those who are not placed in permanent homes will end up on the streets at some point. That was all I needed to hear. It was time for LA5 to refocus its energy on efforts to support foster youth. We did it in the past. We can do it again.

This year, LA5 Community Grants Day, known previously as Fast Five, will focus on the Edelman's Court and the foster care system that supports abused and neglected children. Like Fast Five, we will invite service organizations who support this effort to participate in a fun and educational event. Our goal is to evenly distribute at least \$100,000 between organizations that help children find permanent homes. We will ask our members to nominate worthy organizations through the Children's Court Committee, chaired by LA5 Rotarian Tim Brown. Tim will provide vital education and guidance through the process. All nominations will be made by the committee.

As we prepare for this special day on April 17, I urge you to do two things:

Join the Children's Court Committee. Learn about our past involvement with the Edelman Children's Court. Become an advocate for neglected children.
