

PETER WEINBERGER'S HOMEMADE BLINTZES

STEPS

BLINI

- 4 eggs
- 1 cup flour
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- a little salt about 1/4 tsp (it's up to you)

FILLING

- 1 pound Farmers Cheese or Low Water Ricotta
- 1 egg
- 2 tbsp sugar (not necessary, but can be added based on preference)

- Use a blender or a lot of elbow grease to mix the blini ingredients together. You don't want it to be lumpy. It's got to be smooth (who wants little balls of flour in their blinis yuck).
- When the blini batter is smooth. Heat a non-stick pan. Add a some butter for flavor to the pan but not too much. Pour at most a 1/4 cup of the batter into the hot pan and swirl it around. You want it to be a thin coat on on the bottom of the pan. Let it cook quickly. As soon as it looks solid slide it out onto a waiting plate. Or, if you want to get fancy, flip it over so it's just a little brown on both sides (instead of one).
- The filling is simple. Just put all the ingredients together in a bowl and combine them. Some like more sugar, or lemon or vanilla. I prefer it as simple as possible.

PETER WEINBERGER'S HOMEMADE BLINTZES

STEPS

- Now you've got your blinis and your filling. It's time to make the Jewish burrito. Put your first blini on a plate. Spread a line of the filing along the bottom of the blini. Fold the blini over the filling. Don't make a cigar, make it a rectangle. Then fold the sides in. Flip it over so the sides are underneath your now complete blintz.
- When you've got all the blintzes assembled, heat a pan with some butter. You don't need a lot, just enough for it not to stick and give a nice buttery flavor when you fry the blintzes. Cook them on both sides so that they are nicely browned -- like an over ripe banana, lots of brown but not all brown. The inside should be heated up in the process.
- Serve them on a plate with sour cream and a good jam. My photo has fresh strawberries only because it looks better.

You can have them any time of year, but it's traditional to have them on the Jewish holiday of Shavuot. This is the holiday that marks Moses getting the Torah on Mount Sinai. You traditionally are served two blintzes side by side because they look like a Torah scroll!

Shavuot is a holiday where you eat dairy foods and study Torah all night. It's coming up this year on May 28. That would be a great time to make your blintzes.
