

We are proud to report that earlier in June, we have completed construction on all of our seven Village Rotary Water Management System sites in the Myanmar Delta region. With this accomplishment, we have fulfilled LA 5's 2020 commitment!

Earlier in April, we also completed a "double-size" \$20,000 system to serve a three thousand resident Buddhist monastery and monastic


education center in the Yangon area thanks to the generous support from a donor in Hong Kong. Each of these serves a village population anywhere from 600 to 1500 persons including many children.

They now all have clean drinking water!

Although the inexorable march of Covid-19 throughout our world has forced my return from Myanmar two and a half months ahead of schedule, our awesome team here managed to finish all of our 2020 commitements on budget and well ahead of schedule!

Myanmar Committee Chair Herbert and I are already planning for our 17th project season for 2021. Stay tuned.

SUPPORTING OUR ESSENTIAL WORKERS DURING A PANDEMIC



On a record-breaking temperature day (or at least what felt like one anyway), about 20 Rotarians and family gathered together at Illuminar in Glendale to complete the final round of face shield assembly. These face shields have been donated at no charge to frontline healthcare and essential workers around Los Angeles.

With gloves on, masks up, fans swirling, and Hawaiian music playing, our industrious volunteers powered through the hot day to assemble 1,700 masks on Saturday, July 11, 2020. In total, Rotary LA5 has raised over \$70,000 to produce, assemble and distribute nearly 6,000 masks to many organizations in need. None of this could have been possible without the vision and generosity of our very own Jared Smith, who converted his 3D printing business to produce components of PPE face shields urgently needed by healthcare professionals.

We'd like to thank all of our volunteers and donors that came together to support this wonderful project.
