LADWP WATER SYSTEM STAKEHOLDERS ENGAGEMENT GROUP

New Awareness New Possibilities A first for me in over 40 years in Rotary

President Matt Ball asked me to be (apparently) the first LA5 representative/participant in the LADWP System Stakeholders Engagement Group. My role is to explore the nature of and possibilities for LA5 in this citizen's participation group at LADWP, by invitation from the DWP itself. My first meeting with the group took place August 26th. Other members appear to represent community constituent groups, and perhaps a few themselves as concerned citizens.

The aims of the LADWP WSSEG appear to be to receive information, provide direct feed back to development of and then support for the action plans of the agency, and mobilize community support for implementation plans.

Subjects covered in great detail in my first two and one half hour meeting were all in the category of resource management: water supply, water conservation, water quality, and challenges to supply. Supply challenges identified in the meeting included the potential action of the San Andreas Fault, drought, water cleaning and purification, weather, and regional coordination. Frequent reference was made to a "Master Plan," within which the main focus appears to be water supply, recycling, flood control and the partnerships that usually come from funding decisions. Comments from long-standing members of the WSSEG suggested prior help from the group in the implementation of action plans established by LADWP.

Certainly water is of concern to all, not just Rotary. Rotary and LA5 in particular are focused on service in the community. High quality water for all persons is important in every community to every person. Is this a place for LA5 active involvement? Not sure, but certainly an interesting and important question for a fellow who moved to L. A. in 1947. Stay tuned, fellow Rotarians.
