A MESSAGE... FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Dear Fellow Rotarians,

Last week powerfully brought home to me how deeply committed our Club and its members are to engaging among ourselves and with our wider Rotary community and the world.

Wednesday we had an inspirational joint meeting with the First Five Rotary Clubs and heard Jennifer Jones – the first woman to be a President-nominee of Rotary International – speak about the goals and challenges of Rotary in the world today and how we can build the kind of society we want to live in. She reminded us that we are all stronger and more effective when we join together to accomplish great things. A hard-working committee from all five Clubs is doing just that. They have planned a tremendous joint service project to assemble hygiene kits to distribute to our unsheltered neighbors in Chicago, San Francisco, Oakland, Seattle and Los Angeles to help them cope with the twin scourges of homelessness and a dangerous pandemic.

Thursday was a different kind of coming together (which I'm so sorry that I missed :-(). Members joined on zoom to prepare a meal together, with a notable chef as guide. We may not be able to meet in person right now to share food, wine and friendship, but until those days return we still make efforts to connect with one another and remind ourselves of our community of friends.

Friday was the most meaningful event, to me, of the week. Our Club and many others in RI are grappling with changing needs in a changing world, and struggling to find ways to come together over our common goals and ideals while remaining respectful and open to our differences. It takes real courage, and real caring and commitment, to be willing to have hard conversations about difficult issues. I'm proud, first, of the committee that planned and carried out a thoughtful, meaningful Community Conversation, of all of the LA5ers who participated in the original program and in the meeting on Friday to begin to understand, digest and reflect on what we've learned, and of everyone who's willing to continue the work to really understand each other and deepen our commitment to LA5, to each other and to our shared service to our community.

I joined LA5 in 1994 after working on a project for the Club to help complete the Edelman Children's Court to serve abused and neglected children under the supervision of the dependency court and have participated in countless service projects since then – the Scholarship Committee, Boy Scout Committee, immunization events in the Pico-Union area, Reading by 9, Camp Paivika clean-up days, Angel City and many more. But I have never seen our members more committed and more engaged than now.

I look forward to our journey together to build an even stronger Club.
