A MESSAGE...

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Rotarians,

As I reflect upon two service projects in which LA5 is currently at the center of managing this week, I am grateful to be a part of our Club's influence for good. Rotary carries such a strong name around the world that when we requested 10,000 hygiene kits from a potential partner, we were already a vetted and trusted entity, someone they could easily support. But then when we added the first five Rotary Clubs as a collective entity--all working on a service project together--suddenly our name recognition carried an even greater cache', one that has motivated even more involvement from other partners hoping to be involved with us.

The same is true with State Assemblyman, Anthony Rendon and Senator Brian Dahle. When they were looking for an organization to distribute fresh food for the needy in our community, they turned to LA5 as a trusted entity. Consequently, we partnered with the Salvation Army and are distributing 2,400 boxes (32 lbs/ea) through an interfaith coalition in South Central Los Angeles as well as other partner organizations across LA (Oct. 30, 2020).

Of course, there was Feeding the Front-Line workers during the last few weeks as well as many other humanitarian outreach opportunities which are currently being planned or prepared. (A special thank you to Lauren Schlau and Herb McGurk, Chrissy Moses, Malinda Monterrosa and so many more, showing us how it's done. The Service Committee continues to rock!)

If you do not feel engaged in LA5, or somehow feel disconnected from some of the rather incredible opportunities that continue to arise, I find that there are three clear steps to changing our perspective and hopefully motivating ourselves to take action:

- 1. PAY YOUR ROTARY DUES This not only gives you the moral authority to offer opinions and suggestions on how we can improve, it also gives you satisfaction in knowing that your contribution pays for the administrative duties surrounding activities that truly affect people's lives for the better.
- 2. CHOOSE TO BE INVOLVED When you choose to serve someone besides yourself, it's amazing how your own problems seem so much smaller. Plus, once you've served in the name of Rotary, you can't help but feel energized, grateful and satisfied all at the same time. It simply keeps you feeling young.
- 3. REACH OUT TO OTHER MEMBERS Everyone needs a friend or at least an encouraging word. I find that when I look out into any audience, I realize that everyone has some struggle, some pain and sometimes, debilitating circumstances in their life. Responding to those personal prompts to say something nice, or do something considerate for another Rotarian, will always do more good than you know.

I am continually humbled as I consider each of our LA5'ers and the great fraternity in which we all belong. I hope you choose to engage and do so without feeling overwhelmed. Afterall, out of small things comes that which is great. We don't have to be "huge" in order to be effective or useful. So please join the fun and let yourself feel a part of this awesome club.
