

James McCune Smith, MD, was a man of firsts. In 1837, he became the first black American to receive a medical degree - although he had to enroll at the University of Glasgow Medical School because of racist admissions practices at U.S. medical schools. He was also the first black person to own and operate a pharmacy in the United States and the first black physician to be published in U.S. medical journals.

I checked the email address – "yes, that's me". Just to make sure, I asked Bo if there was a typo and there wasn't. Wow – I was feeling great. I'm Prominent!

As a lawyer, I really appreciate being appreciated. A recent Pew Research Center survey found that only 18% of the public believed lawyers contributed "a lot" to society. Worse, 34% felt that lawyers contributed next to nothing or nothing at all – the lowest scores of the all the professions listed.

So with a cloud of societal contempt hanging over me, it felt appropriate that I was asked to be a facilitator for District 5280's Diversity Equity and Inclusion ("DEI") work shop. Implicit bias? Stigma? Hostility? I've been living it for 30 years!

As we discussed DEI in the work shop, I reflected on a Harvard Business Review article that discussed why most DEI programs fail. https://hbr.org/2016/07/why-diversity-programs-fail. The study found that shaming people about their purported inherent racism or trying to dictate their behavior not only doesn't work, it is counter-productive. The response of most people to being treated this way is resistance and anger. In the words of the authors - "control tactics" don't work.

What does work -- getting people to know each other – getting folks out of their ethnic, racial, gender (or in the present environment, political) isolation by spending time with a diverse bunch of people in a positive social atmosphere. Familiarity breaks down the barriers and preconceptions that have been baked into our minds. Hmmmmm – doesn't that sound like the essence of Rotary?

As the vaccine rolls out. we're finally able to slowly climb out of our Covid mandated isolation. Let's take this opportunity to get together in person. Embrace this opportunity. Take a leap into the unfamiliar. Be a guest at a Lynwood, Watts or Thai Town Rotary meeting. Hangout with the Latinos Unidos club. You'll have fun and make new friends. Isn't that the best way to break down barriers? Isn't that what Rotary is all about?














LA5 Now Welcoming Rotarian Transfers
