
Oh, and as to that Downey loss.... COURAGE my friends, we will live to fight another day!



Presently, I am recovering from a devastating knee injury that has taken months of recovery and rehab to be only 60% of my prior strength and flexibility. It has been a process and an injury I have never experienced before as lengthy recoveries are usually an aberration for me. It was also a hard truth in realizing I was nowhere near in physical shape as I thought nor should be and has pushed me to create a rigorous schedule of working out starting at 6:30 in the morning. While I take pride in my recovery process and workout schedule, I cherish the time with my family above all else, especially during this crisis. My mom works a 9-5 job so I hardly got to see her during the day but now she teleworks from home which has strengthened our bond as we converse and eat together almost every day. She's taught me how to cook seafood and I have to say I have mastered cooking the most delectable fried shrimps. I also perfected my culinary skills with steak which tastes so different now that I am the one cooking it. The only downside is that now I am usually in charge of dinner and it takes a surprisingly extensive amount of time to prepare all the food. My sister recently came back from Berkeley and it has been nice catching up as I have not seen her for months; her Berkeley stories are some of the strangest, to say the least considering the prestige the college holds. Albeit the occasional annoyance as we share a room once again; oh it was so peaceful for a couple of months, it has been a blessing that I will never forget and enjoy while it lasts.




