

THE SECRETARY'S REPORT

Greetings Fellow LA5ers-

I am honored to be serving as Club Secretary during Prez Malinda's adventurous year of community service and deep engagement of our membership.

As I bang this out on my keyboard with two fingers, I clearly remember drafting the agenda for the first meeting of our Club's 114th year.

I mused that if we accomplished 50% of our plan, we'd still be setting a meaningful course of "Service Above Self."

At July's meeting, the Board 1) endorsed our two objectives of raising \$200,000 and making community distributions at an unprecedented level, 2) engaged Samantha Kim as our Club Operations Manager (a task she has delivered with perfection), 3) approved the Club Operating and LA5 Foundation budgets, 4) motioned to distribute over \$150,000 to key community service projects and our Community Grants Fund and 5) still squeezed in reports from each of the Division Co-Chairs. I was pleased to adjourn the meeting with 6 minutes to spare. The early end gave us all a bit more time to fellowship at the home of our host, Foundation Division Co-Chair, Azim Vishani. What a start!

The highlights of our August meeting included a speedy conclusion of our regular business to do a deep dive into the results of the LA5 Membership Survey. Division Co-Chair Barry Hytowitz put forward a summary of the results and led the board in a discussion about how to address sending critical information to all members of the Club. The outcome was the establishment of a clear partnership between Membership and MarCom to get the word out to all. Board members also selflessly offered to take time to call all members of the Club to see how each member is receiving notice of Club Luncheons and Service Projects.

In September, we picked up where we left off on the item of membership engagement and reserved 15 minutes of the agenda to develop strategies to connect meaningfully with all members.


Also on the agenda was the approval of distributing up to \$179,000 to our Club's Scholarship recipients. Members of the board expressed gratitude to Joshua Mandell and all the Scholarship Committee members for their dedicated service to this important initiative of the Club.

Looking forward, I am eager to hear an update from JT Warring on the work in Myanmar and a proposal from Lauren Schlau and IPP Ekstrand on a new project requiring our support.















